## **Checking your allocated studies**



## 1. Click on my studies







2. The page below will appear.

•On the left hand side you will have any studies that your were the responsible consultant for •On the right hand side you will have any active co-ordinator's assessments you have been allocated.







3. Click on the relevant study and the page above will appear.

4. You will be able to see the original forms, the 1<sup>st</sup> line assessment and there Will be a co-ordinator's assessment form that you can complete.



5. Co-ordinator's should carefully read all the forms associated with the study and the assessments before completing the co-ordinators assessment form.

6. The assessment form differs from the old paper version. Above is an example of what appears as the co-ordinators assessment form.





7. The question asks the co-ordinator if they agree with the 1<sup>st</sup> line assessment.

If you choose "Yes" then that is the form completed and you simply have to click "commit".







8. If you choose "no" you don't agree with the 1<sup>st</sup> line assessment then the form opens up for a more detailed co-ordinators assessment, which has 2 pages and allows for clinical codes and ACON codes to be entered.

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9. Co-ordintors now have to explain why they are changing the original assessment and what they are changing it to.
